Points of interest and tourist attractions in São Paulo downtown

Pateo do Collegio and Anchieta Museum

It is the birthplace of São Paulo, where occurred the city's foundation Mass.

The Anchieta Museum consists of religious art collections, an art gallery, a model of São Paulo in the 16th century and objects of the time. It has a nice restaurant and a cafe for a break during the tour in the region.

CCBB - Banco do Brasil Cultural Center

Housed in a beautiful construction of 1927, where the first Bank of Brazil was established, the CCBB offers quality cultural programming, movies, theater, besides coffee and a small bookstore.

25 de março Street

Considered the busiest street of Brazil, Rua 25 de Março offers retailers and wholesalers stores with several options of bijouterie, toys, decorative objects, among others. Its visitors do not even imagine that, until just before 1850, this famous shopping street was a river (Tamanduateí) that received the waters of the river Anhangabaú and emptied into the river Tietê. The Rua 25 de Março bears this name in honor of the enactment of the first Brazilian Constitution of 1824.



Altino Arantes Building

Inaugurated in 1947, with its 161 meters high, is one of the symbols of São Paulo, and can be seen from various points of the city. The building, inspired by the American Empire State, has a observatory on its top which offers a panoramic view of the city.

São Bento Monastery

The site, which hosted Pope Benedict XVI during his visit to Brazil, houses, in addition to the Basilica de Nossa Senhora da Assunção, the monastery with 40 monks, also responsible for the production of breads, cakes and pastries made with exclusive and secular recipes, sold in the local store. In the morning, Masses have Gregorian chants.

Martinelli Building

Opened in 1929, Martinelli, with 30 floors, was the tallest building in the world outside the United States. At that time the controversy was such that its creator, the Italian Giuseppe Martinelli, built his mansion on the roof to prove it was safe to inhabit it. The building impresses with its rich ornamentation and luxurious finish, and offers a beautiful view at the top.

Municipal Theater

Designed by Ramos de Azevedo technical office and opened in 1911, hosted the Modern Art Week in 1922. It is one of the city's icons. It has a beautiful architecture, with pieces of Belgian crystal and coatings with gold leaf. Its stage receives operas, ballets and musicals. Be sure to visit the cafe.

Rock Gallery

It is the nickname of Shopping mall Great Galleries. This true stronghold of rockers and goths, houses stores selling rock bands t-shirts, old vinyl collections, clothing and accessories to attend shows. It also brings together various styles of different tribes, making it easy to find CDs and LPs of rap, hip hop, funk, MPB, hardcore, punk, blues and jazz music; electronic equipments; piercing parts; tattoo studios and even hairdressing salons, among others.

Itália Building/ Circolo Italiano

The second largest building in the city, with 46 floors spread over 165 meters high, Edifício Itália was designed by architect Franz Heep and opened in 1965. The building houses a theater and one of the most traditional restaurants in town, with lovely views of São Paulo cityscape.

Júlio Prestes Station / Sala São Paulo

Station built between 1926 and 1938 to host the Estrada de Ferro Sorocabana, it was inspired by models of the North American stations.

It houses the Sala São Paulo, Osesp headquarters (State Symphony Orchestra of São Paulo), the most modern concert hall in the country and one of the best acoustics in the world.

Museum of the Portuguese Language Luz Station

It is installed in one of the most important buildings in the city's history, Luz Station, a building erected in 1901 and key to the development of the transforming economy of the city, coffee. The museum is the only one in the world dedicated to a language. It uses technology and interactive resources to consolidate itself as one of the most visited museums in the country.

State Art Gallery

The Pinacoteca has ten rooms that house the collection of nearly one hundred thousand works. The museum includes pieces by artists like Victor Brecheret, Tarsila do Amaral, Di Cavalcanti, among others. Also receives renowned temporary exhibitions. There is a delicious coffee that provides lunches outdoors overlooking the Luz Park.

Monastery of Luz / Museum of Sacred Art

Founded in 1774, it is the retreating location of the Conceptionist Nuns who live in seclusion and prepare the famous miracle pills of Friar Galvão. It houses the Museum of Sacred Art, with a collection of over 5 thousand objects and Nativity Scenes.

Be aware of your safety

- Keep your belongings in your field of vision, particularly in large city sites.
- Look for information or assistance with identified people as a police officer or a tour agent.
- Try not to handle cash, cards or use valuables such as jewelry, electronic equipment and cameras in public.
- To exchange foreign currency, look for accredited exchange offices.
- When using ATMs, try to do it during the day and within banking or commercial establishments.
- Use public or authorized transportation (bus, train, subway and taxi). Try to use flagged taxis. Avoid clandestine transportation or offered by strangers. Ask the hotel for the phone of accredited taxis.
- Keep your passport in a safe place, but always carry with you a photo ID.
- Always carry with you the address of your accommodation and useful phone numbers (police, hotel, consulates, people to contact).
- Visit the sights indicated by official agencies ([www. cidadedesao Paulo.com](http://www.cidadedesao Paulo.com)) or programmed by ARInter.

The rate is in the amount of R\$5.00, and can be paid in cash directly to the collector, or the “Bilhete Único” can be used.

“Bilhete Único”

It can be purchased at the SPTrans stations, bus terminals, subway stations and network of affiliated companies. It comprises the public transportations: bus, train and subway.

Subway

The subway runs from 4:40 a.m. and allows boarding until midnight for those who wish to change lines. On Saturdays, the hours are extended until 1am on Sunday.

Single tickets, which ensures the right to one travel, costs R\$5.20.

Train

Metropolitan Trains Company (CPTM) connects São Paulo to 30 cities of the surroundings.

The fare per trip is R\$5.20 and is integrated with the subway.



International Airport

The airport of greater movement in Latin America is 25 km away from Downtown São Paulo.
